Solidarity with Birmingham bin workers' strikes

BIRMINGHAM council are planning to cut 121 waste collection jobs. They have refused to talk to the union—ploughing ahead with issuing redundancy notices.

This is a serious cut to an important public service, it will lead to a worsening of bin collections in the city.

We need to use the local

trade union movement to fully back these workers, who voted by 90 percent for strikes.

The way that they are being treated is utterly unfair.

The council needs to resolve this dispute by lifting this threat to jobs.

It's always working class people who have to pay for austerity whether its through losing their jobs

or through cuts to public services.

The Unite members are currently running daily two hour strikes. They are planning to escalate to 3 hours per day after 28 July.
