Solidarity with Barts NHS Trust strikers

undreds of cleaners, porters, domestics and security staff working across four sites of Barts NHS Trust in East London are striking back after their jobs were taken over by outsourcing multinational SERCO.

The hospital workers are demanding a 30p per hour pay increase after they were offered 1 percent and a ten year pay freeze.

A three day strike from 4 July was followed by a seven day strike from 10 July a fouteen day strike which ended on Monday 7 August. More

strikes have been announced for 18-22 Aug, 25-29 Aug, 1-5 Sept, 8-12 Sept, 15-19 Sept.

These hospital workers need our urgent support.

Wages have been driven down in Britain—led by a Tory government who also give their rich mates tax breaks.

We need a fightback over pay across the unions in the public and private sectors, including coordinated strikes.

The Barts workers are showing how to fight—a victory for them can inspire millions of others.
