BIRMINGHAM council planned to reduce the pay of refuse collection loaders by £5,000.

However, instead of honouring the Acas deal, the council without warning has instead issued redundancy notices to the affected

workers.

The workers have done the right thing by going back on strike. They are being reballoted for further strikes which they say will last into the new year.

austerity whether its through losing their jobs or through cuts to public services.
